The New Substances Notification (NSN) System

Regulated under the CANADIAN ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT(CEPA)

DID YOU KNOW...

Since July 1994, chemical manufacturers and importers of "new substances" must submit New Substance Notifications (NSNs) to Environment Canada before gaining approval to introduce these substances into Canada.

THE RULES HAVE CHANGED...

The Canadian NSN system was overhauled several years ago and the revised regulations (NSNR 2005) were launched in October 2005.

THE EXPECTATIONS HAVE RISEN...

Over the past 5 years, government expectations have risen significantly. Increasing scrutiny of NSNs, rejection of data, and use restrictions, mean that what was once "good enough" for success in the past is often not "good enough" anymore. This recent experience means that today's notifiers need to better understand the current expectations and revisit their strategies for NSN success.
